Descripción: **Background**

As the fish capture production has decreased globally, small-scale inland aquaculture, which can be promoted with low technology and low cost, holds great promise as a new source of sustainable animal protein and other important nutrients. Japan has advanced the aquaculture technology and JICA has carried out the inland aquaculture extension projects by farmer-to-farmer extension approach in ASEAN and African regions.

Job Areas and Organizations

This program is designed for an officer for aquaculture (National, Local), and research institute for aquaculture. In particular, it is a very useful training for officials engaged in field extension activities.

This course will improve the ability of small-scale inland aquaculture which can be applied in their country

- 1) Current Duties: Officers in charge of promotion, management, extension and research on inland aquaculture.
- 2) Experience in the Relevant Field: have at least 3 years of experience in the field of inland aquaculture.
- 3) Educational Background: be a graduate of university or equivalent
- 4) Language Proficiency: have a competent command of spoken and written

English proficiency equivalent to TOEFL iBT 100 or above (This workshop includes active participation in discussions, which requires high competence in English. Please attach an official certificate for English ability such as TOEFL, TOEIC etc, if possible)

5) Technical Requirements a Technology Proficiency

- Basic computer skills such as, sending/receiving email with attachments, and using a web browser.

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Conditions for Participation

The participants of KCCP are required

- (1) to strictly observe the course schedule,
- (2) not to change the air ticket (and flight class and flight schedule arranged by JICA) and lodging by the participants themselves,
- (3) to understand that leaving Japan during the course period (to return to home country, etc.) is not allowed (except for programs longer than one year),
- (4) not to bring or invite any family members (except for programs longer than one year),
- (5) to carry out such instructions and abide by such conditions as may be stipulated by both the nominating Government and the Japanese Government in respect of the course,
- (6) to observe the rules and regulations of the program implementing partners to provide the program or establishments,

- (8) to discontinue the program, should the participants violate the Japanese laws or JICA's regulations, or the participants commit illegal or immoral conduct, or get critical illness or serious injury and be considered unable to continue the course.
